Paul -


- Travels from Jerusalem toward Damascus to arrest followers of Jesus (Acts 9:1, 2)
- Is converted on the Damascus road (Acts 9:3-5)
- Is brought to Damascus where he stays and preaches the Gospel (Acts 9:6-25)
- Spends some time in Arabia, returns to Damascus (Gal. 1:17-23)
- Goes to preach the Gospel in Jerusalem (Acts 9:26-28)
- Flees the Hellenists to Caesarea and then sails for Tarsus (Acts 9:29-30)

Paul and Barnabas


- Barnabas brings Paul to Antioch where he helps teach the church in Antioch (Acts 11:25, 26)

Paul's Second Journey: AD 49-51




Paul's Third Journey: AD 52-57



Paul's Journey to Rome: AD 57-62



- Philemon Appeal for Christian unity and forgiveness for a runaway slave.

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The Book of Romans

b Date: **c. AD 56-57**

The whole Gospel: God's plan of salvation and righteousness to Gentile & Jew, written to the church in Rome, power center of civilization at that time.

The Book of Romans – Key Verses

I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. ¹⁷ For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."

Romans 1:16-17

But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. ²² This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. ²⁵ God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished...

Author: Apostle Paul

Date: **c. AD 49**

Theme: Salvation is by grace alone, and the Old Testament Law is not only unnecessary,

but harmful.

Purpose: To correct the false teaching of Judaizers who had misled the Galatian churches

after Paul planted them.

I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. ²¹ I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!

Concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered to him, we ask you, brothers, ² not to become easily unsettled or alarmed by some prophecy, report or letter supposed to have come from us, saying that the day of the Lord has already come. ³ Don't let anyone deceive you in any way, for that day will not come until the rebellion occurs and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the man doomed to destruction.

2 Thessalonians 2:1-3

The Book of 1 Corinthians

Key Verses

- If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. ² If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. ³ If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing.
- ⁴ Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. ⁵ It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶ Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.
- ⁸ Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰ but when perfection comes, the imperfect disappears. ¹¹ When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me. ¹² Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.
