



Paul's First Journey: AD 47-49









The Book of Galatians

- Author: Paul, the Apostle.
- Date: Probably AD 47-49, making it perhaps the oldest of Paul's letters.
- Recipients: Churches in the Roman province of Galatia, probably those begun by Paul in the cities of Antioch, Iconium, Lystra and Derbe during his first missionary journey.
- Major Theme: Justification is by grace through faith in Christ alone.
- "...know that a man is not justified by observing the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by observing the law, because by observing the law no one will be justified."

Galatians 2:16







Main Points in Galatians

- Paul is a true Apostle (by special appointment) and his teaching is true.
- Salvation is by grace alone, through faith. We cannot be saved by works or the Law.
- Through Christ, we are heirs to God's promised redemption, and are set free.
- We must use our Christian liberty to serve God and do good for other people.

Key Verses

I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. ²¹ I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!

It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.







The Book of Ephesians

- Author: Paul, the Apostle.
- Date: Probably AD 60-63, during Paul's imprisonment in Rome. (The first of four "Prison Epistles.")
- Recipients: The church in Ephesus, in Asia Minor; or possible as a circular letter intended for all the churches in Asia Minor.
- Major Theme: The gracious position of redeemed Christians, & how this should be reflected in how they live their lives – especially in the unity of the Church.

The Book of Ephesians

Key Verses

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. 10 For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Ephesians 2:8-10

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. ²
Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. ³ Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. Ephesians 4:1-4
