




Major Arenas of Conflict in the Middle East

- 1. Between Islamic Middle Eastern people/countries and the West.
- 2. Between religious and political factions within Islam in the Middle East (Shia v. Sunni; Salafi or Shia Islamists v. moderates; Sunni Sudan v. Shia Iran; etc.)
- 3. Between Israel and many neighboring Middle Eastern countries, especially over issues in Palestine.
















The McMahon-Hussein Correspondence, July 1915-January 1916


The Sykes-Picot Agreement, May 1916



"We Arabs... look with the deepest sympathy on the Zionist movement. Our deputation here in Paris is fully acquainted with the proposals submitted yesterday by the Zionist Organization to the Peace Conference, and we regard them as moderate and proper. 




Israeli territorial changes 1949 - 1967











Israeli Settlements on the West Bank Patterns of Growth, 2013
